

Skilled to Thrive: Service Alignment Resource for Advocacy & Information Providers May 2017

Some of the diverse services that Advocacy & Information (A&I) providers currently deliver under the umbrella terms 'advocacy' and 'information' may, when viewed as distinct areas of work, be services that an A&I could offer under the NDIS. NDIS Services are described under **3 Support Purposes: Core, Capital** and **Capacity building** in NDIS Individual Plans. Each Support Purpose has a number of **Support Categories** within it. These have varying rules for how the participant can spend the money. (See Appendix A)

Your skills as an advocacy and/or information provider will tend naturally to capacity building, however, depending on what your organisation specialises in, or evolves to through your client consultations and strategic direction, you may see synergy in other Support Purposes such as Core (Assistance with Daily Living (Support Category 1.01), or Assistance with Social and Community Participation (Support Category 1.04)).

This resource provides some correlation on where activities your organisation may be delivering now might sit within the NDIS landscape primarily with regard to Capacity Building in NDIS Individual Plans. Our suggestions are not definitive and you should consult the <u>NDIS Provider</u> <u>Toolkit Guide to Suitability</u> and the most recent <u>NDIA Price Guide</u> in making decisions for your business. (The Price Guide will have the most up to date information on specific line support categories.)

Organisations should register with the NDIS for services they wish to provide (refer to the NDIS Provider Toolkit <u>Registration Groups (Module 2</u> <u>Registering as a Provider</u>) and claim payments using a "best fit" approach: against a support line item that most closely aligns to the service they have delivered.

How to read this document: Outlined are two Registration Groups that your organisation may have existing skills and expertise to deliver services within. Activity skill sets are marked in a column under 'If some of your activities include...' When you have located your activities, follow the column down to the NDIS Support outlined which may align with your activities.

Note: Although we provide suggestions of how your organizational activities currently may fit into the NDIS landscape, we do not indicate through this guide that you should necessarily continue doing only that which you have done previously. Identifying and responding to the needs of your clients in the unfolding NDIS landscape may include developing innovative responses to support 'gaps' in the market.

Current Activities and NDIS Alignment

1. Registration Group: Assistance in Coordinating or Managing Life Stages, Transitions and Supports (Life Stage, Transition)

Support Categories: Coordination of Supports (3.07); Improved Living Arrangements (3.08); Increased Social & Community Participation (3.09)

This is classified as a **CAPACITY BUILDING** support.

This includes short and long-term supports that focus on strengthening the participant's ability to coordinate their supports, and to assist them to live at home and participate in their community.

Supports include:

• Support Connection

• Coordination of Supports

Please note that Specialist Support Coordination is listed under a separate Registration Group: Support Co-ordination (0132). We have included it here as it is grouped with Support Connection and Coordination of Supports in the Price Guide. (see P3 & 4 for more)

Other Supports in Life Stage, Transition include:

- Assistance with accommodation and tenancy obligations
- Life transition planning including mentoring, peer support, and individual skill development
- Assistance with decision making, daily planning, budgeting

1. **Registration Group: Assistance in coordinating or managing life stages, transitions and supports (Life Stage, Transition)** (continued) This is classified as a CAPACITY BUILDING support.

2. Registration Group: Development of daily living and life skills (Development – Life Skills)

Support Categories: Improved Daily Living (3.15), Improved Relationships (3.11), Increased Social & Community Participation (3.09), Coordination of Supports (3.07)

This is classified as a **CAPACITY BUILDING** support.

This focuses on training and development activities undertaken by the participant or their carer to increase their ability to live as autonomously as possible, including supports that will enhance the ability of the participant to travel and use public transport independently.

Supports include:

- Training in planning and plan management
- Skills development in a group
- Individual skills development and training
- Individual social skills development
- Individual skills development and training, includes public transport training & support
- Training for carers / parents

- Disability Support Worker (includes Mental Health or Peer Worker)
- Welfare worker

3. Registration Group: Management of Funding for Supports

Support Category: Improved Life Choices (Support Category 3.14)

Plan Management (0127)

This is classified as a **CAPACITY BUILDING** support.

Plan management is the financial management of the plan and includes making payments to providers, expense claims

processing, developing monthly statements for participants and claiming payment from the NDIA. Financial intermediary funding applies to registered plan management providers who deliver plan management supports. A financial intermediary, Plan Managers also liaise with providers and participants to implement and manage the plan.
